HOW TO USE THE COUNTRY MATRIX SPREADSHEET FOR REGISTRATION

INTRODUCTION

The Country Representation Matrix is the document you will use to determine which countries and committees you will request for your group. Since each country has a pre-determined number of seats on various committees (GA Mains, GA Specials, and ECOSOC committees), your group's size will be an important factor when identifying the best country fits. Specialized Agencies, many of which have unique roles, are requested separately. Each of these steps is detailed below.

We do our very best to honor your requests, whether for specific countries or for regional preferences. However, this is only possible when this matrix is utilized properly. Please carefully review these guidelines and contact us (registration.nhsmun@imuna.org) if you have any questions.

The left side of the matrix lists all countries of the UN, while the top of the matrix lists the committees featured at NHSMUN 2018. To identify whether a country is represented in a given committee, look to the right of the country name where the column of the committee intersects the row of the country. If a "1" is present, then that country is represented in the committee. On the far right side of the matrix, the minimum and maximum delegation sizes for each country are listed, and they are calculated based on the committees in which the country is represented. When selecting country preferences, the size of your delegation should generally fall between these two numbers, and as close to the maximum number as possible. In many cases, schools with larger groups of students will need to represent two or more countries. In these cases, please be sure to request countries whose total maximum numbers add to the approximate size of your group. If your group size presents an exception to these guidelines, let us know and we can troubleshoot with you!

The matrix is divided into three sections: (1) countries alphabetically, (2) countries by maximum delegation size, and (3) specialized agencies. These first two sections are identical and contain the same information in different orders, while the third section is specific to specialized agencies. Registration for specialized agencies is separate from the minimum/maximum numbers section, and those numbers are factored into your total group size separately (read below for more details about how specialized agencies work).

MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM NUMBERS

The most important thing about using the spreadsheet to make country selections is to note the minimum and maximum numbers in the columns at the far right. The countries you will be able to request are contingent upon these numbers. For example, if you are bringing 18 students, please only request countries for which 18 is equal to or below the listed maximum, or those requests cannot be honored. Additionally, the closer your group size is to the maximum size of the countries of your preference, the more likely we will be able to accommodate your requests (e.g., if you are bringing 12 students, it is better to request countries with a maximum of approximately 12, as opposed to a country with a maximum of 20).

DOUBLE DELEGATIONS

Please note, committees that are starred ("**") allow for double delegations (two students per committee). While it is often advisable that you put two delegates on each of these committees, it is not absolutely required that you do so.

BRINGING FEWER THAN 7 DELEGATES

If your group has fewer than 7 delegates, or if you are part of a group of one or more single delegates, please do your best to match your group size to the minimum/maximum sizes of each country you request. If this is not possible, please provide a description of your country and committee preferences in the “Comments” section of your registration submission, so that we can accommodate you to the best of our ability.

BRINGING MORE THAN 25-30 DELEGATES

The largest countries can accommodate approximately 25-30 students. If your school will have more than 25-30 students, the remaining students can be assigned to specialized agencies, or, you can request a second country. For example, hypothetically, if you plan to bring 32-34 students, you might choose to request a country that has a high maximum and then request placements on specialized agencies for the remaining seats. Alternatively, you could also request to have two countries whose maximums total to 32-34. Should you plan to bring 40 or more students, you will almost definitely need to request two countries, which (combined with any specialized agencies) have appropriate maximum/minimum numbers to accommodate your total group size. Larger schools would likely request three countries, and so forth.

SPECIALIZED AGENCIES

The specialized agencies’ representation arrangement is visible at the end of the document, after the matrix for the *GA Main/GA Special/ECOSOC* committees. Please note that countries in the *GA Main/GA Special/ECOSOC* committees are requested and assigned SEPARATELY from those in the Specialized Agencies. For example, being assigned China on the *GA Main/GA Special/ECOSOC* committees will have no effect on whether or not that school will represent China on the Security Council or other specialized agencies. Additionally, as there are limited spots on specialized delegations, placement on them cannot be guaranteed, so registering early is recommended.

You’ll note that each specialized agency has a slightly different structure. SC and HSC for example, are each composed of different countries. On the other hand, the ICJ and ICC are each comprised of 15 judges, represented by 15 different delegates. If requesting a seat on the ICJ or ICC, it is implied that the slot is for an individual judge (student). Similarly, delegates in CRISIS, HISTORICAL CRISIS, and ILO will represent specifically assigned roles in those committees.

When registering, you will be asked for your requests for specific specialized agency committees, as well as the countries or roles that you would most desire. We will do our best to accommodate your requests.

How to Read the Country Representation Matrix:

Welcome to the NHSMUN 2018 Country Representation Matrix. This matrix will be used by you, a Faculty Advisor, to identify country preferences during the registration process. For those of you who have registered before, you can go ahead and dive right in, but for those of you who are new to the process, or need a refresher, I've provided step-by-step instructions below on how to read and use the matrix. As always, please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

First and foremost, it's important to understand the matrix is divided into three sections. The first section lists countries alphabetically, the second lists countries by maximum delegation size, and the third section lists our specialized agencies. The first and second sections have the exact same information, just in different orders, while the third has different information from the first two.

In order to read the matrix, you will first look down the far-left column to identify a country. After identifying that country, if you look across the row, you will see a series of boxes filled with either 1's or blanks. If you look across the top row, you will see a list of committees. Look down to the box that lies at the intersection of that column and the row of the country in which you are interested. If the box contains a 1, then the country is represented in that committee; if it is blank, then the country is not represented in that committee. For example, in the visual below, if we look at Albania, we can see that it is represented in: DISEC, ECOFIN, SOCHUM, WHO, ITU, UNICEF, UNHRC, and CSW. Conversely, Albania is NOT represented in SPECPOL, UNEP, UNODC, UNCTAD, AU, OAS, UNESCAP, or WTO. This representation yields a maximum of 16 students who can represent Albania in the GA Mains, GA Specials, and ECOSOC committees.

Next, we'll explain how to read the committee names. NHSMUN 2018 is composed of 4 different organs: GA Mains, GA Specials, ECOSOC, and Specialized Agencies. The first two sections of the country matrix show representation in all of the organs except Specialized Agencies, which are represented in the third section. Committees are displayed across the top of the matrix by the organ in which they reside. Committees whose names are followed by two asterisks (**) are double delegation committees. All other committees are single delegation committees. Double delegations can, but do not have to be, represented by 2 delegates from a school. While we recommend that schools do send two delegates to our double delegation committees, it is possible and allowable for only one delegate to serve in one of these committees. In the single delegation committees, schools are represented by only one delegate, and it is not possible to assign two delegates to these committees. In the above example, all committees with the exception of WTO are double delegation committees.

The far-right column has the minimum and maximum delegation sizes. When selecting a country, you should only select those for which your total group size falls between the minimum and maximum (as close to the maximum as possible) or for a larger delegation, between the combined minimum and maximum sizes of multiple countries (again, as close as possible to the total of the maximums). If requesting specialized agencies, this will impact your size considerations as well, so be sure to factor this in! Let us know if you have any questions, and we will be very happy to assist.
